




Discover Home *Find the hidden sights of the southwest*

Below: The International UFO Museum and Research Center at 114 Main, Roswell, N.M. is approximately 110 miles southwest of Cannon and was organized to inform the public about what has come to be known as "The Roswell Incident," according to the Web site at www.iufomrc.org/mission.shtml. Exhibits of written, audio and visual formats that are relevant to the

1947 Roswell Incident and other unexplained phenomena related to UFO research help provide the most qualified and accurate up-to-date information available, according to the Web site. Open from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., seven days a week. Adult admission is a donation of \$2, 18 and under admission is \$1 and infants are admitted free.

Right and bottom right: Palo Duro Canyon is approximately 100 miles southeast of Cannon and offers panoramic views of the canyon that is 120 miles long and 20 miles wide. "Palo Duro" is Spanish for "hard wood," in reference to the juniper and mesquite trees. Park hours are 8 a.m. to 10 p.m. daily. Day users must exit the park by 10:00 p.m. The daily entrance fee to Palo Duro Canyon State Park is \$4 per person. Children 12 and under, school groups (kindergarten through college), participating in school sponsored functions are admitted free. Any facility or overnight fees are in addition to the daily entrance fee. There is no additional fee for the park's day-use facilities and no reservation is required for those areas. Palo Duro Canyon State Park has back-packing, equestrian camping sites, developed primitive areas, electrical sites and cabins. There is a fee for camping facilities in addition to the entrance fee. 





Left: The Buddy Holly Center is located at 1801 Avenue G, Lubbock, Texas and is about 100 miles southeast of Cannon. The Buddy Holly Gallery features a permanent exhibition on the life and music of Buddy Holly. Artifacts owned by the City of Lubbock, as well as other items that are on loan are presented in this exciting exhibition. Included in the display are Buddy Holly's Fender Stratocaster; a songbook used by Holly and the Crickets, clothing, photographs, recording contracts, tour itineraries, Holly's glasses, homework assign-

ments, report cards, and much more. Information from www.buddyhollycenter.org. Admission to the Buddy Holly Gallery is \$5, senior citizens (55 and over) \$3, students (with valid I.D.) \$2, children under 12 are free, as are members. Ask for the military discount and show ID. Operating hours are 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Tuesdays through Fridays, and 110 a.m. to 6 p.m. Saturdays. The center is closed Sundays and Mondays. For more informaton, call (806) 775-3560.
