
Enjoy the sights of the southwest



At the UFO museum there are exhibits relevant to the 1947 Roswell incident and other unexplained phenomena related to UFO research. The museum is open 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. seven days a week. Adult admission is \$2, 18 and under is \$1 and infants are free.


